

COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES
CITY OF LAWRENCEBURG
SEPTEMBER 2, 2004

The Mayor and Board of Commissioners met in regular session. The following members were present: Commissioner Bid Lindsey, Commissioner Keith Durham, Commissioner Buford Goolsby and Commissioner Tim Dickey. Mayor Allen Chapman was absent.

With a quorum present, the meeting was called to order. The meeting opened with Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Dickey made a motion to approve the minutes of the August 19th Commission Meeting, with a second by Commissioner Goolsby. Motion passed unanimously.

Under new business Commissioner Dickey made a motion for the City of Lawrenceburg to hold a Special Called Commission Meeting to set the tax rate on September 9 at 6:00 p.m. Commissioner Goolsby made a second to the motion and it passed unanimously.

Attorney Betz presented two items for consideration.

Resolution # 2004-2-9 – To reappoint Monica Sanders, Ronald Fox and Jonathan Weathers to the Lawrenceburg Parks and Recreation Advisory Board with terms to expire 8-3-07. Commissioner Goolsby made a motion to approve, with a second by Commissioner Dickey. Motion passed unanimously.

A Resolution to approve the lease purchase of a dozer did not receive a second. Motion failed.

Commissioner Durham made a motion to suspend the rules to have Mike Weathers discuss the lease-purchase of the dozer, with a second by Commissioner Dickey. Motion passed. After discussion Commissioner Dickey would like to look at the possibility of purchasing a new one, before leasing a rebuilt one.

Mr. Tom Appleton addressed the Commission and expressed appreciation for their hard work on the budget and encouraged them to *over* communicate with simplicity to the public their decision and reasons for the increase.

Mr. Bobby Thompson addressed the Commission concerning the trash behind the Old Timers Club. People other than the businesses in that area are dumping all kinds of debris, and the majority of those dumping do not put the debris into the dumpsters. It looks like a dump there. He asked the city to look at ways to keep the area clean. There is a possibility the Police Department may have to get involved. The parking lot belongs to the City of Lawrenceburg and is used by the businesses in that area.

With no further business to come before the Board, a motion was made by Commissioner Durham to adjourn, with a second by Commissioner Dickey. Motion passed. Meeting adjourned.
