

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
CITY OF LAWRENCEBURG

November 10, 2010

The Board of Mayor and Council met in regular session. The following members were present: Mayor Durham, Council Member Ronald Fox, Council Member Jerry Moore, Council Member Jamie Sevier, and Council Member Robin Williams.

With a quorum present Mayor Durham called the meeting to order. The meeting opened with Prayer led by Mayor Durham and the Pledge of Allegiance led by Council Member Fox.

Motion to approve the minutes of the October 28, 2010 Council Meeting was made by Council Member Williams with a second by Council Member Fox. Motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Durham announced that City offices would be closed for Veterans Day on Thursday, November 11, 2010 and that garbage pickup for Thursday would be done on Friday, November 12, 2010. The Veterans Day parade will be on Thursday, November 11, 2010 at 11:00 a.m. There will be a flag retirement ceremony at Mimosa Cemetery immediately following the parade. Mayor Durham reported that the LCHS football team will be playing at Tullahoma Friday night in the state playoffs.

City Administrator William McLain reported that he met with County Finance Director Teresa Purcell and Sheriff Jimmy Brown regarding requests from the County for the City to participate in the funding for three projects. 1. The Library received a grant for four computers of \$2,000.00. They are asking us to split the match of \$1,892.00 for a cost of \$946.00 each. Mayor Durham recommended that we split this special expense, and Mr. McLain will do a Budget Amendment for this request. 2. The Historical Society needs to make repairs to the Old Jail Museum at a cost of \$1,700.00 and are requesting \$850.00 from the City. The Council recommended for the County to get involved with a civic organization and hold a fundraiser for this project. 3. The Sheriff's Department is asking us to split the cost of a new Finger Printing Machine which is \$34,000 total cost. The Council recommended that the County pay for this from taxes since several law enforcement agencies throughout the County are using this service when booking prisoners.

Mr. McLain also reported that bids had been received for the welcome signs coming into town. Sign Designs had the lowest bid of \$1,899.00 per sign. The Council recommended we do three signs leaving out the one on the north side of town for a total of \$5,697.00 and that we keep the planters at the sign locations and use posts and no brick.

Vic Pusser with the Lawrenceburg Utilities System addressed the Council regarding facility charges on City utility accounts. TVA contracts set forth two charges LUS is allowed to charge, a facility charge (investment or equipment charge) and an energy charge. There was a 30-year agreement between LUS and the City on some of the Bobby Brewer Park fields. LUS officials are continuing to look into the agreement between LUS and the City.

Mayor Durham turned the meeting over to City Attorney Alan Betz for legal issues.

City Attorney Betz had one Resolution for Council consideration:

A RESOLUTION FOR THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAWRENCEBURG, TENNESSEE TO CALL FOR AN ELECTION OF THE MAYOR, COUNCIL SEAT 1 AND COUNCIL SEAT 2 IN ACCORDANCE WITH PRIVATE CHAPTER NO. 99, OF THE PRIVATE ACTS OF 2008.

Motion to approve this Resolution was made by Council Member Williams with a second by Council Member Sevier. Motion passed unanimously.

With no further business to come before the Council, a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Williams with a second by Council Member Sevier. Motion to adjourn passed unanimously.
